NKRTL-PAC ENDORSEMENTS AND/OR RECOMMENDATIONS

Northern Kentucky Right to Life Political Action Committee has issued **Endorsements and/or Recommendations** of some candidates in the **upcoming election of November 2, 2004**. These are based not only on the stated public positions of the candidates, including their answers to NKRTL’s questionnaire, but also their past public records: Based upon the firm belief that what one has done is entitled to significantly more consideration than what one says (“By their fruits, ye shall know them ...” Matthew 7:16), NKRTL undertakes herein to publish what it knows of the public record of these candidates, whether they are incumbents or not.

The gravity of the surgical slaughter of 4,400 innocent children each day — one every 20 seconds — demands that we ask of every citizen, particularly those aspiring to public office: “What are you doing to stop the killing?”

NKRTL-PAC does not necessarily make **Endorsements and/or Recommendations** in every race. NKRTL-PAC never endorses a candidate unless he is 100% Pro-Life, with no exceptions. Sometimes, when NKRTL considers a candidate superior to the rest of the field, it will make a Recommendation, even though the candidate falls short of its 100% standard for Endorsement.

NKRTL must point out to the reader that some candidates have taken it upon themselves to modify our questions, thereby failing to answer them specifically, and indeed making exceptions of their own, while simultaneously attempting to answer “yes,” to attempt to present a Pro-Life position. Since the candidate has not answered “no,” and their response cannot be truly reported as “yes” after they have modified or imposed conditions of their own, NKRTL has appropriately reported those evasive answers with an asterisk (*). They failed to answer the questions as asked. Such action by the candidate deprives the voter of information on the candidate’s position on the issues which the candidate avoided answering.

U.S. PRESIDENT

NKRTL-PAC **Recommends** a vote for **President George W. Bush (R)** over his opponent, **U.S. Sen. John F. Kerry (D)**. Bush’s record does not warrant an endorsement, but his opponent is so far worse that NKRTL-PAC recommends President George W. Bush. See lengthy comparison of records in newsletter.

U.S. SENATOR

Incumbent **U.S. Sen. Jim Bunning (R)** has a 100 percent Pro-Life voting record in the U.S. Congress, as he did in his previous service in the Kentucky State Senate. While he answers all of the questions on NKRTL’s questionnaire in a Pro-Life fashion, unfortunately his record of performance is not compatible with his answers. Contrary to his affirmative answer to Question 8, that he would “refuse to support in any manner a candidate for public office who publicly states acceptance of the current status of legalized abortion...,” he has indeed supported pro-abortionists for public office, including a \$1,000.00 contribution in September, 1999 for Peppy Martin (R), a pro-abortion candidate for governor of Kentucky. **It is obviously inconsistent to claim to be Pro-Life, and simultaneously support for public office candidates who, upon their election, would actively and effectively contribute to the maintaining in place of the killing machine.**

To the shock and disappointment of Pro-Life Kentuckians, Sen. Bunning presented as the main speaker at his recent reelection fund raiser in Kentucky, former New York major Rudolph Giuliani (R), despite advance protests to him by NKRTL. Giuliani is a strident and active pro-abortionist, and pro-sodomite, who, while mayor of New York City, moved his mistress into his bedroom while maintaining separate

quarters down the hall for his wife (whom he subsequently divorced) and children. The inexcusable scandal of inviting such a person to appear on his campaign platform is that it tells the public that these other matters are unimportant, or certainly not issues which disqualify a person from public support – and that of course is a detestable lie.

State Sen. Dan Mongiardo (D) declined to answer our questionnaire. He also has a pro-abortion voting record in the Kentucky General Assembly.

At the last legislative session, Sen. Mongiardo cast another strong pro-death vote, approving cloning. Northern Kentucky **State Rep. Joe Fischer (R)** authored a bill which would prohibit all cloning, i.e., the artificial creation of a new human being, outside of the womb, which bill passed the House of Representatives. By the time the bill got to the Senate, the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville weighed in with their objections to the bill, arguing that it would deny research money to their medical schools. A floor amendment to Fischer's bill was offered changing the bill so that the only thing that would be prohibited was the "clone to live" procedure, under which a new human being is artificially created outside of the womb and permitted to come to full development. The amendment approved so called "research cloning," which is really "clone to kill" and permits the artificial creation of such a human being, and then its destruction in medical experimentation. While the harsh reality was of course effectively covered by the usual euphemistic language, the reality of course is that "a rose is a rose is a rose...", and that the artificial creation of a human being is always wrong, and is certainly never permissible in order to create human guinea pigs for medical experimentation. Have we forgotten so soon the horrors we condemned at Nuremberg 60 years ago of the medical experimentation upon human beings conducted by the Nazis?

NKRTL-PAC Recommends a vote to reelect Sen. Jim Bunning (R).

U.S. REPRESENTATIVE, 4TH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

While **Mr. Clooney** did not answer NKRTL's questionnaire, he has been quoted in the secular press as supporting abortion in the cases of rape and incest, i.e., capital punishment for the innocent unborn child, who is thus killed for the crime of the father. It is ironic that Mr. Clooney is opposed to capital punishment for those convicted of serious crimes, but favors capital punishment for innocent unborn babies.

U.S. REPRESENTATIVE, 6TH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

Ben Chandler (D) is a former attorney general of Kentucky and recent unsuccessful candidate for governor of Kentucky. He has a frequently stated public record in support of *Roe v. Wade* and total abortion on demand.

State Sen. Tom Buford (R) gave 100 percent Pro-Life responses to the questionnaire. Mr. Buford is a member of the Kentucky State Senate from Nicholasville, Kentucky, with a 100 percent Pro-Life voting record.

NKRTL-PAC endorses Sen. Tom Buford (R).

STATE SENATOR, 11TH DISTRICT

NKRTL-PAC endorses the reelection of Sen. Richard L. Roeding (R).

STATE SENATOR, 17TH DISTRICT

Incumbent **State Sen. Damon Thayer (R)** answered the questionnaire 100 percent Pro-Life, and has a Pro-Life voting record in his one term in the state senate. His opponent, **Cliff Wallace (D)**, declined to answer NKRTL's questionnaire.

Mr. Wallace has made political campaign contributions to pro-abortion candidates including **Ben Chandler (D)** and **Grant County Judge-Executive Darrell Link (D)** who was one of the leaders who are continuing the policy of the Northern Kentucky Independent District Health Department Board of spending taxpayers' funds for abortifacient drugs and contraceptive devices to teenagers without even the knowledge or consent of their parents. Mr. Link was also in fact one of the opponents of the initiative at the Health Board for "abstinence only" education in the public schools, which would reverse the previous policy of "how to" sex education to our youngsters including grade school.

STATE SENATOR, 23RD DISTRICT

Sen. Jack Westwood (R) answered NKRTL's questionnaire with 100 percent Pro-Life answers, and has a Pro-Life voting record in the state senate in his two terms.

His opponent, **Kathryn Groob (D)**, declined to answer NKRTL's questionnaire. Bumper stickers supporting Groob have been seen: "Support Groob: Your vote for a *choice* in Frankfort," the unmistakable inference being to the pro-abortion rallying code word, "choice." Information from the Kentucky Registry of Election Finance shows that she made substantial contributions to the political campaign of Kentucky Attorney General Gregory Stumbo (D) who has a 100 percent pro-abortion voting record and who when he was majority leader of the Kentucky House of Representatives was singly responsible in that position for prohibiting Pro-Life legislation from reaching the floor for vote by the entire membership.

Westwood was a co-sponsor of constitutional amendment in Kentucky to ban "sodomatrimony," i.e., same sex marriages or civil unions. Groob is silent on this issue.

After several deaths and resurrections, **SB 245, the Marriage Protection Amendment**, was finally recognized as the will of the people, and passed overwhelmingly. Initial and long obstructionism practiced by the Democratic leadership in the Kentucky House of Representatives, with the usual subtle subterfuges practiced by the pro-death community, in this instance, offered an amendment that would accept the prohibition of same sex marriage, but simultaneously approve "civil unions," and then in another instance combining the prohibition with a totally unrelated proposed constitutional amendment. This latter tactic would likely have encumbered the bill with baggage that might result in voter defeat, and even of more importance would violate a provision of the Kentucky constitution that only a single topic can be made the subject of a proposed constitutional amendment for the consideration of the voters. Our opponents are clever. Legislative deception is versatile and persistent.

In the last analysis, however, the bill passed, and will be on the ballot in November for the consideration of the voters, to establish the public policy of this state to condemn and disapprove of same sex marriage and civil unions, preserving the societally-essential institution of marriage, a sacred covenant between one man and one woman. The Bluegrass Poll, taken in May by the Kentucky *Courier Journal*, found

that 70% of Kentuckians favor this amendment. Of that number, 82% said they attended a church, mosque, or synagogue weekly. Fifty-four percent (54%) of those who opposed this sanctity of marriage legislation stated that they never attend religious service. Another clear litmus test of the clearly divided battle lines.

NKRTL-PAC endorses the Marriage Protection Amendment to the Kentucky Constitution.
